DOLA Orthotics: Empowering Clinicians Through Education and Innovation

We sat down with Luke Sinclair and Claire Nichols, co-founders of DOLA Orthotics, to discuss their mission of making orthotic prescription accessible, and their exciting new partnership with Canonbury.

Q: What inspired you to start DOLA Orthotics?

Claire Nichols: It all started when Luke and I were university classmates studying podiatry. We saw a gap in the market for accessible education and practical support for clinicians when it came to orthotics. Orthotic prescription often feels daunting or overly complex, so we wanted to demystify the process and help practitioners feel confident in using orthotics to support their patients.

We recorded clinical demonstrations and orthotic modification techniques for remote use, which became invaluable for both students and clinicians. This experience inspired us to release the material more widely through our YouTube channel, which now has over 200,000 views. It's clear there's a huge appetite for self-learning.

Q: Tell us about your product ranges and how they cater to clinicians

Navigating the Changing Landscape of Nitrous Oxide Legislation in Healthcare

As healthcare professionals, we are accustomed to adapting to new regulations that aim to balance public safety with the clinical needs of our patients. The recent reclassification of Nitrous Oxide (N₂O) as a Class C drug under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 highlights this balance. While its recreational misuse has led to significant public health concerns, the vital role nitrous oxide plays in medical practice, including podiatry, remains recognised by the law.

Nitrous Oxide is indispensable in podiatry for cryotherapy procedures, such as treating verrucae, where its rapid freezing capability offers precision and patient comfort. Despite its classification change, practitioners can still legally possess and utilise nitrous oxide within their clinics, provided its use adheres strictly to professional guidelines. At Canonbury, we remain committed to supporting you in meeting these requirements through rigorous adherence to distribution standards.

Understanding the Changes

The legislative shift was driven by rising recreational misuse, particularly among young people. Inhaling nitrous oxide for its psychoactive effects not only risks severe health outcomes, such as peripheral neuropathy and vitamin B12 deficiency, but has also contributed to environmental and societal concerns. Empty cartridges littering public spaces and incidents of impaired driving have fuelled the need for stricter controls.

For medical professionals, the classification means heightened responsibility in the storage, use, and documentation of Nitrous Oxide. While no special licence is required for podiatric practice, practitioners must be able to demonstrate a legitimate clinical need if questioned. This highlights how important it is to keep clear records and make sure Nitrous Oxide is safely stored and used in your clinic.

Clinical Implications

The broader health risks of Nitrous Oxide misuse are increasingly visible in clinical practice. We're seeing more cases of patients with unexplained nerve problems, often linked to recreational Nitrous Oxide

use. This is a reminder of the broader social issues we're dealing with as healthcare professionals. It is crucial to remain vigilant during patient assessments, recognising the symptoms and understanding the underlying causes are essential steps in ensuring comprehensive patient care.

Canonbury's Commitment to Compliance and Education

At Canonbury, we have implemented measures to ensure compliance with the new regulations. Nitrous Oxide is available exclusively to verified podiatry and healthcare practitioners. This includes requiring HCPC registration numbers or equivalent proof of professional status for all purchases. Additionally, we have ceased supplying cartridges to non-medical sectors, reinforcing our focus on ethical and lawful distribution.

We are also dedicated to equipping you with the knowledge and tools to navigate these changes. From proper handling techniques to eco-conscious disposal methods, our resources and training opportunities (see our range of webinars) are designed to support your practice in achieving the highest standards of safety and efficiency.
